For those of you who have sponsored your own studies, I salute you for denying yourselves many pleasures to graduate today.

I also want to acknowledge the faculty and the management for the tireless work they do to ensure the seamless transition of our students from freshmen and women to the proud graduates we are celebrating today.

And to our graduation class, the victory and pride is all yours. Your efforts are now rewarded, and may they enrich your life endlessly. Celebrate this day, for you have earned it.

A lot goes into ensuring that all the students we take in graduate on time and with outstanding skills and competences. At Riara, we strongly believe that beyond the degree, our purpose is to nurture holistic graduates who are equipped to handle complex challenges that you will face for the rest of your adult lives. Quality, not quantity, is our commitment.

The last census in Kenya showed that less than 5% (actually only 3.5%) of the Kenyan population have a first degree, which is very low compared to countries which have over 30%. You as the educated of this country must therefore step up to the plate to be counted among the change-makers that we need in this country. I note that our Graduation Theme of this year, which is **Empowered Changemakers** was truly inspired. This is because it was crafted before the GenZ protests yet it so fittingly describes what we expect of you. Nothing encapsulates the power of an educated populace than what we have witnessed in the last month. Your protests as Gen Z have brought in an unprecedented level of civic engagement in public affairs, causing real and permanent change in this country. I applaud you greatly and I ask the congregation to join me in applauding these brave young men and women.

This is what we had in mind when we came up with the theme of Empowered Changemakers and that is what Riara University has made you; Fearless, Tribeless; Crusaders; Defenders of Justice; Innovators; Servants of the People; and truly Patriotic Leaders who are driven by ethics and values! The future of this country and continent is in your hands. Go out there with audacity tempered with pragmatism and an undying spirit of learning. As the French Nobel Laureate, Andre Gide said, "Man cannot discover new oceans unless he dares to lose sight of the shore."

So, what shores are you willing to lose to discover new oceans of possibilities out there? So many opportunities lie ahead of you. Embrace them and never let one pass by.

Finally, my prayer for you is that the Almighty God may protect you, guide you, connect you with your purpose, and give you the courage to pursue the purpose for which you were created! Go make yourselves, your parents, guardians, Kenya, and all of us truly proud!
